Killiow

You may remember from the last newsletter, No 21 - March 2003, that we were waiting for a definitive estimate of the costs for operating at Killiow. This has now been received, dated 16 July 2003!

To get straight to the bottom line, the income required by Killiow to maintain completely the two courts for us would be about £6,000 per year. This would equate to a basic subscription of £120 per member per year, assuming a membership of 50 (more until that level were achieved).

The lawn construction and equipment costs would remain as outlined in the last newsletter.

Discussion at the AGM lead us to believe that a basic subscription at such a level together with the responsibilities associated with obtaining and honouring the conditions of any grants and loans obtained would be unacceptable to most members. We will therefore reply to Killiow to the effect that we consider the proposals too expensive for us.

It was also discussed at the AGM whether it might be better to buy or rent an appropriate piece of land and "do-it-ourselves". We see no way that the necessary labour (and possibly some of the expertise) can be made available to build and then maintain such a facility to the required standard. Most people will wish to attend the Club to play Croquet, rather than for turf care and other maintenance tasks.

Porthpean

The owner of Porthpean Farm, who already operates a golf course there, is very keen to expand his operation and is considering the construction of two full size croquet courts. Part of the construction costs would be met with the help and advice of the Business-Link Grants and Support Scheme.

Matters are at a very early stage but the hope is that Porthpean Farm may be in a position to construct the two full-size courts, provide a small equipment hut and use of the golf clubhouse facilities. We would provide all playing and associated equipment (hoops, balls etc) and pay an annual subscription. The level of the annual subscription necessary is yet to be determined. Planning permission previously obtained by the Club is now expired but we see no reason for a new application to be denied.

This scheme could provide us with a long-term and secure Club headquarters.


We will call an extraordinary meeting to discuss developments at Porthpean at an appropriate time and if the negotiations start to look promising.

If this project goes ahead, progress will be rapid and we may find ourselves playing croquet at Porthpean to ward the end of the 2004 season!!

In the meantime we have two new venues available to us in addition to Paul Schofield's and Malcolm Hooper's lawns, at Falmouth (see next item).

Despite the continuous rain, 14 players entered, from all parts of the County.


The winner was Ian Wilson on 18 points and the runner-up Elizabeth Schofield on 16 points.
