Chairman's Corner

The new season is just around the corner and will be here before we know it. The lawns are in good shape, and have stood up well to the winter's use. The cold weather has stopped the grass from growing, but not the hardy members who turn out on club days and at other times. The short-lawn competition has been on-going and is being closely contested. The competition will end on Saturday 27th March, and the winner will be presented with the trophy at the AGM on the folloing day. Our thanks go to Des Honey for taking over the recording and organising of results etc.

When I was last at the club, in mid January, there appeared to have been no Golf Ladder matches played during the winter. If sufficient matches have been achieved by any idividual by the 27th March, then a presentation will be made at the AGM. Ladders for both the codes will start afresh at the start of the season.

Copies of the fixture list have been circulated with the AGM material; a proper fixture card will be available at the AGM, or afterwards in the clubhouse. There will be no increase in subscriptions recommended by the committee this year: they will be due on 1st April.

There are various pre-season coaching sessions taking place this month – details are given below. Cliff Jones, who is organising a two-day course covering Association and Golf Croquet, is a recognised national coach who was presented with a special award last year for his services to coaching. Members with all levels of proficiency will benefit by taking part. Those wanting only golf tuition will be accommodated during the first day, which will also cover the common parts of the two games. However, those wanting more advanced tuition will be catered for during both days.

There will have to be a small charge to cover Cliff's motoring expences and the booklette that he is preparing for the Association players. This will work out at £2 per head per day for petrol, plus £6 for the booklette -a small price to get your season off to a good start.

Don't forget the Golf Improver Course on the 22nd March. Names to me please by 19th March. See the note in your AGM papers for details.

As the new season approaches, new rosters for the cutting of the grass and whitelining will be required. We need volunteers to help with these essential duties. The club does not run itself, but relies on members to do their bit to ensure that it runs efficiently. We are indebted to those who cut the grass, maintain the equipment, keep the clubhouse stocked, do various work on the sheds, organise the various teams, turn up to coach others, arrange the fixtures, organise and manage the tournaments, do the secretarial work and keep the books straight. There is also the job of being on hand to serve the teas when visiting teams are playing – we have a reputation for our hospitality.

Association Improver Days have not proved to be as successful as hoped. This is no reflection on either the coached or the coaches, but rather a situation where a class consists of those wanting different levels of help that cannot be covered without overlooking the needsd of others on the course. With this in mind, the Improver Courses have been abandoned (which accounts for the apparent lack of activity on the fixture list) in favour of preclub-day sessions on particular topics that individuals want, or which the trainers think will be of value. The system will not be restricted to Association Croquet; specific topics will be covered prior to Golf Club days as well. The first Golfing subject will be the tangled web of Wrong-Ball play, to which I would expect a good turnout, judging by the number of times I have been asked to give refereeing decisions on the subject. So make a

date for **Thursday 15th April at 1.00 pm.** (bring a pencil or pen with you).

There is a notice in the clubhouse giving details of how you can request any particular topic. We don't need large numbers to trigger a session – it's up to each individual to know what's wanted to improve his/her play.
